Upcoming volunteer opportunities include moving log seating into place, helping with the green shore armouring, sealing the timbers in July, and planting in September. David to contact Cam Purdon re updating the kiosk at the bottom of the creek with a new roof, removing the current sign, and cleaning up the timbers.

## **Grandon Creek Smolt Count**

Box is back in operation after the tree removal. Need more sand bags, David and Gord to source and put in place. There were a couple of fish on May 8th. David to contact Dave Davies re permitting and design to put a permanent base in place.

## **Grandon Creek Invasives and Planting**

The trail may be closed at the moment, David to check with Cam re an invasive removal at the top near Hoy Lake Road. It is too late for planting now, we should plan for the fall.
